The Department of the Attorney General administers the Criminal Property Confiscation Grants Program on behalf of the Attorney General which draws on funds collected under the Criminal Property Confiscation Act 2000. Under this advertised application-based program, eligible incorporated not-for-profit organisations and local government authorities can apply for one-off funding for projects which run for a minimum of one and a maximum of two years. Grants can only be used to prevent or reduce drug-related crime and drug abuse, support crime victims and to aid law enforcement.

Criminal Property Confiscation
Grants Program



The Department of Immigration and Citizenship administers the Settlement Grants Program (SGP) that aims to deliver services that assist eligible clients to become self-reliant and participate equitably in Australian society as soon as possible after arrival. Funding is offered annually. Priorities are informed by an annual assessment of settlement needs to ensure that services provided are targeted towards those communities and locations in greatest need of settlement assistance and responsive to changing settlement patterns and needs. SGP funding is on a project basis and offered for periods of one, two or three years.
