



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

According to the 2011 Census, the Town of Narrogin LGA has a total population of **4,219** people:

- 13.7% were born overseas
- approximately 8.6% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 5.3% speak a language other than English at home.

 (Total – Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
