


## CARAD RUNS DISASTER RESILIENCE WORKSHOPS

Disaster Resilience project (DRP) is an educational program that helps the asylum seeker and refugee communities develop their knowledge, skills and awareness about the disasters and emergencies that effect our Australian community. The aim of the program is to increase resilience and coping mechanism by building capacity, increasing trauma informed and culturally safe information and awareness. The program includes Face to Face and Online community education activities (trainings) that covers the following topics:

- > Information about disasters including **BUSHFIRE**, **FLOOD**, and **COVID 19** that affect the WA community.
- > How to deal with these challenging situations and develop trauma informed and culturally safe information and awareness.
- > How to stay safe and independently manage your vulnerability in case of unexpected disaster or emergency.
- > How to build/improve resilience and coping mechanisms.
- > How to build network with community and service providers



- School age children are welcome to attend the workshops and benefit from the opportunity.
- Interpreters are available.
- ✤ Car park is available.
- Participants will receive fuel voucher to cover the cost of their traveling to and from the training venue.
- Lunch and refreshment are provided.
- Participants will receive a certificate by the end of the program.



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The DRP's trainings includes online and face to face sessions.
