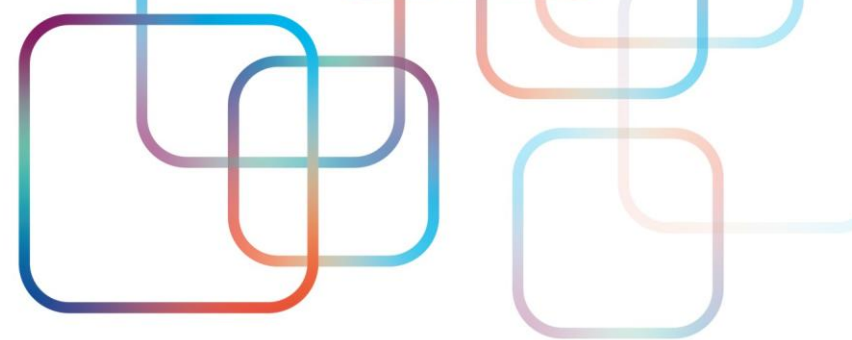


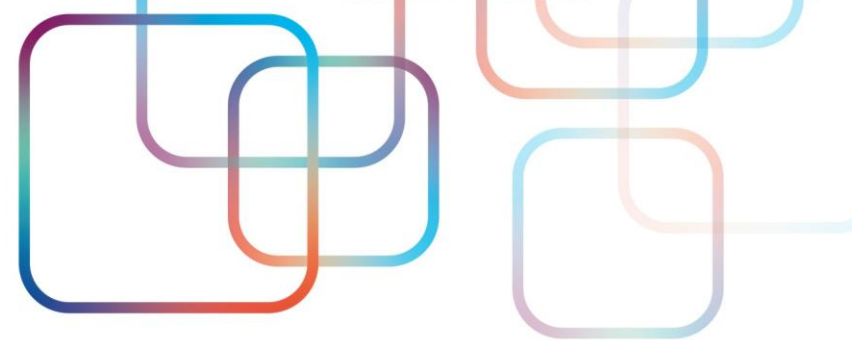

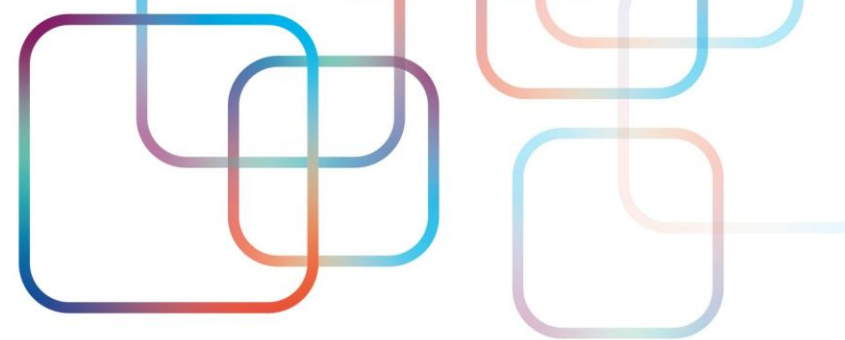

These issues include parenting, housing, cultural differences, family dynamics, language barriers, and family and domestic violence. The program will deliver one workshop a week over 10 weeks at Redcliffe Community Centre. Participants will undertake a sewing class followed by facilitated sessions on various topics addressing community needs. Program partners and facilitators include ASeTTS, Communicare, Mirrabooka Service Centre, and the Department of Communities - Child Protection and Family Support team.	Community Capacity Building

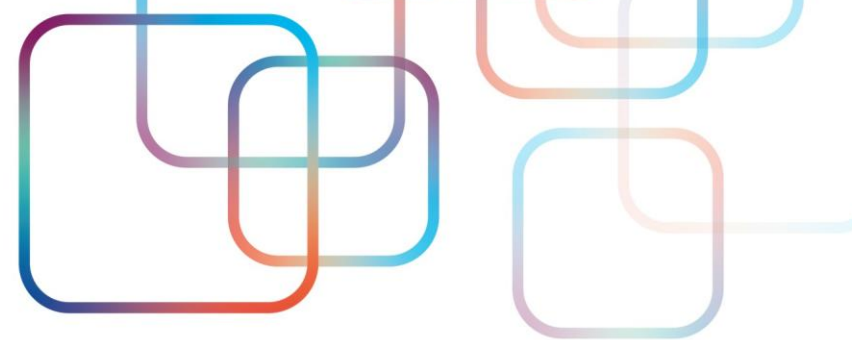

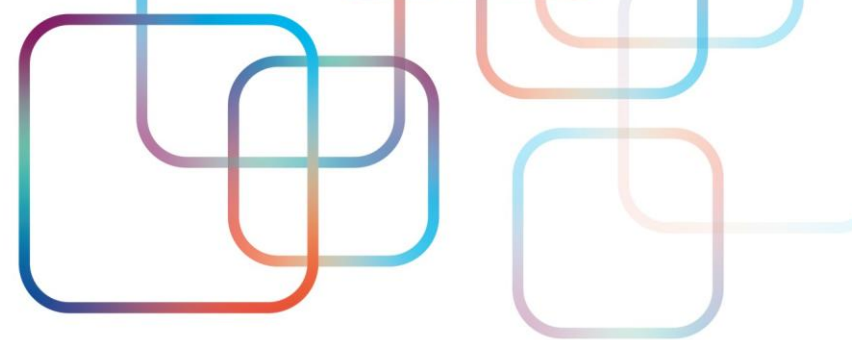

Malayalee Association of WA (MAWA)	\$4,218	Safe Steps: Empowering Seniors, Inspiring Futures – Safe Steps is a community project designed for the Malayalee community in Western Australia. Held on 7 October at the Melville Community Centre Hall the project aims to address two key aspects: promoting senior citizens' safety by providing information sessions on preventing injuries and falls; and supporting high school-aged students through presenting various pathways options for their future. Through sessions led by a professional Rheumatologist, seniors will gain insights into injury prevention and fall safety measures. Simultaneously in an evening session, high school students will have the opportunity to explore career and education pathways, guiding them toward making informed decisions about their future. These informative sessions will be facilitated by Senior Teachers and Professors. Safe Steps aims to foster a supportive and inclusive environment while bridging the generation gap within the Malayalee community, promoting well-being, and inspiring a brighter future. Australian Asian Association will deliver a Driving, Sewing, and Swimming program that targets CaLD women from refugee migrant backgrounds from Middle Eastern countries including Afghanistan and Syria as well as Burundi, Myanmar, Eritrea, and The Republic of Congo. This project is delivered following the successful trial of the programs delivered last year. Participation in the program is subsidised and culturally appropriate licensed instructors have been selected to facilitate. Sessions for each program will run every week for approximately seven months and will be delivered at the organisation’s Perth and Gosnells office, swimming classes will be held at the Cannington Leisureplex. Program partners supporting promotion and referrals include CARAD, Red Cross, Culture Care WA, Australian Karen Organisation Inc and Towhid Association, additionally Royal Life Saving WA will facilitate the swimming lessons.
