<p>Aussie Indian Sports Club Inc</p> <p>Project Region Perth Metro – South</p>	<p>Multicultural Volleyball Festival</p> <p>The Aussie Indian Sports Club will host a Multicultural Volleyball Festival on 26 March at Curtin Stadium in Bentley. This community event aims to encourage participants to join in physical activity while socialising and networking with people from many different communities. The participating teams represent a variety of CaLD groups including Indian, Sri Lankan, Malaysian, Afghan, Filipino, Samoan, Fijian and Singaporean teams.</p>
<p>Bangladesh Australia Association of WA</p> <p>Project Region Perth Metro – South</p>	<p>Explore Arts and Culture</p> <p>Through their Pathshala Bangla School, the Bangladesh Australia Association of WA will hold an "explore arts and culture" day on 19 March in Canning Vale. The event will bring together community language schools from the Indian, Nepalese, Sri Lankan and Thai communities to participate and showcase their culture. A professional artist will be engaged to deliver a painting workshop that will explore each participants' culture through artwork, music, and dance performances.</p>

The concert will be held at the Perth Concert Hall on 19 March.</p>
<p>Goldfields Community Legal Centre Inc</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Goldfields-Esperance</p>	<p>Everyone Belongs</p> <p>The Goldfields Community Legal Centre will host a community sporting day at the Ray Finlayson ground in Kalgoorlie on 18 March to bring together local CaLD communities, including members of African, Indian, Indonesian, Papua New Guinean, South American and Filipino associations and groups. Popular sporting activities such as soccer, netball, volleyball, and rugby will be used to create a day of fun and a sense of belonging in the community.</p>
<p>Hrvatska Folklorna Grupa Zagreb</p> <p>Project Region Perth Metro – South</p>	<p>Folkloric Costume Display Workshop</p> <p>Hrvatska Folklorna Grupa will partner with the Croatian Community Centre in Fremantle to host a community day on 18 March that centres around the group's collection of traditional costumes. <p>Kimberley Arts Network</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Kimberley</p>	<p>I See You, You See Me</p> <p>The Kimberley Arts Network will engage award winning Broome-based artist Amelia Jajko to facilitate a portrait painting project for Years 5 and 6 students from Broome Primary School. The school has a high percentage of students from CaLD and Aboriginal backgrounds. Students will be paired with another student from a differing cultural background or heritage and will be led through conversational knowledge sharing and creative thinking exercises to develop a portrait of one another. The completed portrait will be exhibited at the Broome Public Library throughout Harmony Week.</p>
<p>Mandurah Filipino-Australian Multicultural Community Inc</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Peel</p>	<p>Harmony Concert</p> <p>The Harmony Concert will be held on 18 March at Greenfields Family and Community Centre. The concert activities include singing in different languages, traditional dancing and African drumming, all which will encourage audience participation. The event will be delivered with assistance from the Mandjar Toastmasters and Seascapes Community Association.</p>
<p>Mandurah Filipino Sports Club Inc</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Peel</p>	<p>We Belong as One Harmony Cup</p> <p>The We Belong as One Harmony Cup is a day-long volleyball and basketball tournament held in Mandurah on 19 March. This activity is a partnership between Mandurah Volleyball Association and the City of Mandurah’s Club Connect program. Leading up to the event, teams are invited to register to compete in a knockout tournament style competition.</p>

Members of local CaLD communities and other community groups will be invited to attend.</p>
<p>Peel Multicultural Association Inc</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Peel</p>	<p>Harmony Week Expo & Community Lunch with Multicultural Performances</p> <p>The event is an inclusive, collaborative celebration that showcases cultural performances and food from CaLD communities in Mandurah. The event will be held on 17 March at the association’s new premises at Sutton Hall in central Mandurah and will be hosted with the City of Mandurah community development team and the Mandurah Multicultural Network. Attendees are encouraged to wear cultural attire and bring a plate of traditional cuisine to share.</p>

The event targets the local mainstream community within the City of Armadale. Other community associations, community language schools and cultural groups have been invited to participate in the event to promote intercultural understanding and education.</p>

<p>Shire of Kellerberrin</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Wheatbelt</p>	<p>Celebrating Harmony</p> <p>The Shire of Kellerberrin serves the communities of Kellerberrin and Doodlakine. Celebrating Harmony will be held on 23 March and targets the entire community. Local Filipino, Indonesian, Indian and Aboriginal community members will contribute to a program of art demonstrations and workshops, music, food, and dance performances. There will be a multicultural art competition where the winners will be displayed on Kellerbellin’s main street for 12 months.</p>
<p>Shire of Irwin</p> <p>Project Region Regional – Midwest</p>	<p>Dongara Denison Harmony Week Morning</p> <p>The Shire of Irwin will host a morning tea that brings together the local Sikh community, the Sea Totem Wattandee Aboriginal community, and Greek community to promote intercultural understanding and harmony. Attendees and participants will meet at the river mouth near Sea Spray for a special Welcome to Country. This will be followed by Hatha Yoga on the beach and walking meditation where participants will share stories of cultural significance about connection to land. The event will close with a community breakfast hosted by the Greek community.</p>
