



## Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Armadale Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Armadale LGA has a total population of 62,296 people:

- 30.0% were born overseas
- approximately 10.5% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 9.6% speak a language other than English at home.
