According to the 2011 Census, the Belmont LGA has a total population of 35,209 people:

- 37.2% were born overseas
- 24.6% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 23.8% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).
