Cambridge Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Cambridge LGA has a total population of 24,965 people:

- 28.9% were born overseas
- 13.1% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 11.9% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
