



## Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Canning Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Canning LGA has a total population of 85,514 people:

- 45.9% were born overseas
- 32.9% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 31.7% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
