



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

East Fremantle Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the East Fremantle LGA has a total population of 6,930 people:

- 25.3% were born overseas
- 9.1% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 8.9% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
