



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Kalamunda Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Kalamunda LGA has a total population of 53,567 people:

- 27.9% were born overseas
- 9.7% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 7.8% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
