According to the 2011 Census, the Mundaring LGA has a total population of 36,529 people:

- 27.3% were born overseas
- approximately 10.3% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 5.0% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total – Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
