Rockingham Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Rockingham LGA has a total population of 104,105 people:

- 31.4% were born overseas
- 6.1% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 5.8% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
