According to the 2011 Census, the Swan LGA has a total population of 108,461 people:

- 30.3% were born overseas
- 15.6% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 15.7% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
