According to the 2011 Census, the Albany LGA has a total population of **33,650** people:

- 19.4% were born overseas
- approximately 7.0% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 5.2% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total – Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
