



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Bridgetown-Greenbushes Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Bridgetown-Greenbushes LGA has a total population of 4,321 people:

- 22.3% were born overseas
- approximately 2.9% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 3.3% speak a language other than English at home.
