



## Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Bunbury Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Bunbury LGA has a total population of 31,348 people:

- 20.7% were born overseas
- approximately 5.5% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 7.5% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
