According to the 2011 Census, the Chittering LGA has a total population of 4,428 people:

- 23.9% were born overseas
- approximately 6.0% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 3.6% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
