According to the 2011 Census, the Coolgardie LGA has a total population of 3,999 people:

- 20.8% were born overseas
- approximately 5.3% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 6.4% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
