



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Donnybrook-Balingup Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Donnybrook-Balingup LGA has a total population of 5,320 people:

- 19.4% were born overseas
- approximately 3.8% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 5.2% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
