



Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Greater Geraldton Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Greater Geraldton LGA has a total population of 37,161¹ people:

- 14.4% were born overseas
- approximately 6.0% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 5.8% speak a language other than English at home.

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable

by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
