## According to the 2011 Census, the Lake Grace LGA has a total population of 1,360 people:

- 13.2% were born overseas
- approximately 2.9% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 4.1% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total – Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
