- approximately 4.8% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 7.2% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total – Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
