According to the 2011 Census, the Moora LGA has a total population of 2,477 people:

- 12.1% were born overseas
- approximately 4.0% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 2.8% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
