



## Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Plantagenet Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Plantagenet LGA has a total population of 4,879 people:

- 20.6% were born overseas
- approximately 3.5% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 4.7% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
