



## Selected 2011 Census data on cultural and linguistic diversity in WA

Shark Bay Local Government Area

According to the 2011 Census, the Shark Bay LGA has a total population of 857 people:

- 18.4% were born overseas
- approximately 6.2% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 3.1% speak a language other than English at home.

Ancestry is calculated as:

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).

Percentages are calculated by dividing each variable by the fixed figure, consistent with ABS methodology.
