According to the 2011 Census, the Toodyay LGA has a total population of 4,389 people:

- 21.7% were born overseas
- approximately 5.5% were born in a non-main English speaking (NMES) country
- 3.0% speak a language other than English at home.

(Total - Not Stated = Fixed Figure).
